



## Langton Green C.S.A : Opposition Team Covid-19 Guidance

In addition to the [government](#) and [FA guidance](#) on Covid-19, which all visiting teams should have read and be following, the below key points should be read by all visiting players, coaches and supporters.

- Langton Green CSA's risk assessment is online, for you to read, at [langtongreencsa.org.uk/covid/risk/](http://langtongreencsa.org.uk/covid/risk/)
- All players, coaches and supporters should self-screen for symptoms of Covid-19 prior to attending any football activity and if symptomatic, not attend under any circumstances and follow government guidance for those with Covid-19 symptoms. Both teams' managers / Covid officers should be told.
- Each of our teams has a designated parent assigned as a Covid-19 Officer. One of their roles will be to ensure supporters from both teams follow social distancing guidance. Please assist them and respect any request to stick to the guidance. Anyone not from the same family or support bubble should be 2m apart and groups of more than 6 people congregating are not allowed. Please also follow this guidance when arriving, leaving and approaching our venues.
- If teams or their spectators are unable to stick to the guidance, we support stopping the match.
- At 3G facilities, please follow instruction on which entrance / exit to use and where to wait / warm up (socially distanced) before the match. Please do not enter the "cage" until you are told you can.
- Some of our venues have other facilities – play areas, table tennis etc. These are not to be used.
- If toilets are open, it will be on a one in, one out basis. The exception will be a situation where assistance is needed (a parent and their young children for example, or someone with a disability that requires they have assistance). If Kent is in tier 3, no toilets will be open.
- Supporters should bring their own hand sanitiser and use it before / after touching shared surfaces.
- It is the responsibility of each team to ensure their own players stick to the guidance.
- We will be displaying QR Code posters at all our venues. Anyone aged 16 or over who has the NHS Track and Trace app installed can optionally scan these posters to "check in" when they arrive.
- Because the app / QR codes will not cover everyone, we ask that each coach keeps a record of their own attendees (this should cover players, spectators, coaches and officials). These details should be kept for 21 days and in the event of a Covid case during that time, both teams should liaise to ensure everyone on each list is contacted for Track and Trace purposes.

We've had some question the Covid rules – please remember it makes no difference if you agree with them or not. They are there for a reason, often stipulated by the venue we're using and are non-negotiable.

We're all in this together. Thank you for doing your bit to help us and please know that when we visit your club, we will do the same. If you have any questions, please ask the coach of your Langton Green opposition. They will do their best to either answer directly or refer you to someone else who can.
